YOUR MENTOR

Beacon Mentors are the expert advisors on your side. They will use their skills, experience and dedication to help you find the answers you're looking for. They'll provide the motivation to make discoveries, cover new territory, and explore your future.

Beacon Mentors volunteer their time. They have made the decision to contribute to their communities, and have a genuine interest in the future of young Australians like you. Beacon Mentors want to create opportunities, provide support and advice, and make a difference.

Their commitment to you and your future is real.

SAFE JOURNEYS

As with any journey, it's not just up to the guide to get you to your destination. As an explorer, you have some responsibilities as well. Here are some tips and rules that will help make your travels safe, enriching and exciting.

MYROAD ENVIRONMENT

MyRoad is very similar to many other online environments, and online etiquette applies in MyRoad, just like anywhere else. Audio and video are on all the time – so your Beacon Mentor can hear everything you say and see your actions.

YOUR INFORMATION IS CONFIDENTIAL

You are able to talk openly with Mentors about the issues that are important to you and your future. What you choose to share with MyRoad Mentors will not be shared with anyone else. Mentors take this responsibility very seriously and work hard to create relationships based on trust and respect. The only time when Mentors or teachers may be required to share information is if they believe your personal safety is at risk.

SAFETY

Beacon works hard to make its online environments safe for everyone. We make sure that we follow legal regulations, and that our volunteers are aware of their responsibilities when working with you. There are some things you can do to make sure you're safe as well.

KEEP YOUR PERSONAL DETAILS SAFE – Don't provide your contact details to anyone through MyRoad. You should not provide contact details or personal information, such as your address, phone number or social media contacts, to Mentors or other MyRoad participants.

LET SOMEONE KNOW IF YOU FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE AT ANY TIME – whether it's something you've experienced, seen or are uncertain about. If you don't think someone is behaving appropriately, tell your teacher, school principal, a parent, or someone you trust.

BEHAVIOUR

Beacon Mentors respect the work you're putting in, and encourage respectful behaviour while you're participating in the MyRoad program. MyRoad is a program to give young Australians an understanding of what professional working environments are like, and as such, we encourage and expect professional behaviour from everyone who participates. In particular, be mindful of speaking one at a time and not speaking over others during the mentor discussion.
