What is your number one top tip for students wanting to get into a career like yours?

Having strong "people skills" is really important in my job. This means knowing how to communicate well, to lots of different types of people, having good time management skills and being a good listener. It also helps if you have a strong desire to make work better and "fun-er" for people! I would say that being a good problem solver is a big part of my job.

Are there any resources you would recommend for students interested in getting into your profession?

You can google a lot these days so I would recommend googling Human Resources to understand the many different parts that make up my job. Other good resources are the Australian Human Resources Institute (AHARI) website and something I use a lot is the Fairwork Australia website which will give you a good idea of the different topics I regularly help people with.

What would you say are the top 3 skills required for someone in your profession?

You need to be resilient, because sometimes you will deal with difficult, personal and not so nice things. You need to be a good listener, actively listening to people and taking what they say on board. You also need to have empathy; being good at understanding the other person's perspective will mean you can find a better solution to whatever problems they might be facing.
